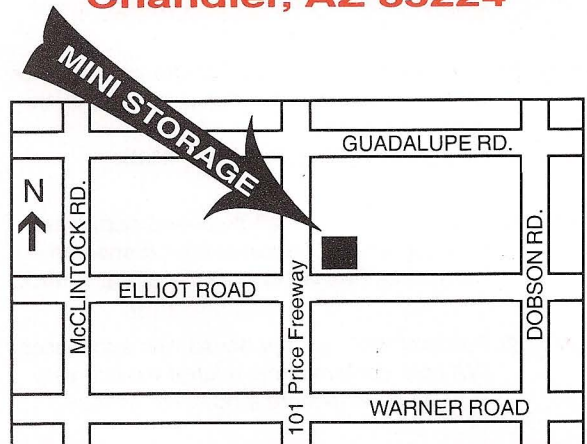

PICKING A UNIT

Self-storage is the most economical and convenient way to store your property.

When choosing a unit, remember that the rent is determined by the unit's size. Ask the facility manager to help you choose a size which fits your requirements.

Remember a (smaller) efficiently-packed unit will cost less than a (larger) unit in which the contents are poorly arranged.

UNIT SIZE

- 5' x 5'** Small furniture such as a chest of drawers or chair, plus boxes & miscellaneous small items. Office or personal records and/or work tools and equipment.
- 5' x 10'** Sofa & chair, chest of drawers or dresser, box spring and mattress set, plus small items and boxes. Or bicycles, motorcycles, appliances.
- 8' x 10'** Furniture from a small one-bedroom apartment without appliances, small boxes and miscellaneous small items.
- 10' x 10'** Furnishings from a one-bedroom apartment with one or two appliances plus boxes and small items.
- 10' x 15'** Furniture from a two-bedroom house or apartment with appliances, miscellaneous items and boxes. A small car may fit in storage space.
- 10' x 20'** Furniture from a three-bedroom apartment or small house with appliances, miscellaneous items and boxes. May be used to store a car or truck.
- 10' x 25'** Furniture from a small three-bedroom house with appliances, miscellaneous items and boxes. May be used to store a boat, car or truck.
- 15' x 20'** Furniture from a large house with appliances. Will hold contents from a large moving van. May be used to store a boat, car or truck.
- 18' x 24'** Furniture from a 4 - 5 bedroom house with appliances and items from garage such as lawn equipment, pool side chairs and several boxes. May be used for vehicle storage. Commercial and or business use.

STORAGE TIPS

- Fill boxes to capacity. Partially full or bulging boxes may tip or collapse. Heavy items like books or tools should be packed in small boxes so they are easy to lift. Protect your fragile goods with packing (i.e., bubble-pack or other) and place them near the top of your storage space.
- Pack books flat to protect their spines. Do not place boxes directly on concrete floors, but use pallets or skids to prevent moisture. Use packing to fill out empty pockets in the boxes. Do not pack fragile items in the same box with books and do not overload.
- Label Boxes. Take home a list of your labeled boxes for easy reference when you need to locate your goods.
- Store heaviest boxes on bottom. All boxes should be full before stacking.
- To maximize storage space use uniform size boxes.
- Pack the storage space carefully. Leave air space around the perimeter to aid ventilation. Place a pallet on concrete floors and do not lean items against walls. Leave a walkway to the rear of your space for easy access. Use all the space available, including the height, and place frequently used goods near the door.
- Stand sofas and mattresses on end on pallet or plastic sheet and protect items with plastic covers or sheets or blankets. Disassemble beds and tables and wrap legs or put them upside down on floor. Stack boxes on dressers and use drawers to store delicate items. Store light chairs inverted seat-to-seat.
- Wrap large lamp bases in padding and pad smaller lamps and put them in boxes. Pack delicate lamp shades separately.
- Pack mirrors, windows and screens on edge, not flat. Protect them by packing individually with strong cardboard.
- Clothing, curtains and drapes should be cleaned and stored on hangers. Hanging cartons are available on site.
- Appliances should be clean and dry. Leave refrigerator or freezer doors ajar. Some goods can be stored in appliances and stacked on top of them.
- Use plenty of packing paper for dishes and glasses. Each item should be wrapped individually.
- Do not store food or other perishable items which could decay or attract insects or rodents. Also, do not store flammable or toxic items in your unit.
- Bicycles and other metal items should be wiped with a rag containing a few drops of machine oil to retard rust.
